Grown from corm, seed or cutting

- 31. A Houseplant

Rules Governing the Show

Judges will be using RHS judging standards. For any queries on exhibiting, contact the Show Secretary at show@fdgc.uk

1. All classes open to anyone living or gardening in the parish of Fen Ditton, with a CB5 8 postcode, or any member of the Club. Except for Section E.
2. No joint entries will be accepted.
3. Entry forms to be completed and in the hands of an official by 8:00 p.m. on Wednesday 9th September 2026.
4. All classes are free to enter.
5. Exhibits to be taken to the Fen Ditton Community Primary School between **9:00 and 10:30 a.m.** on Saturday 12th September 2026. An official will be present from 9:00 a.m. onwards. The hall will be cleared for judging at 10:30 a.m. **Exhibits not staged by this time cannot be considered.** No exhibits to be removed before 3:45 p.m.
6. All exhibits in Sections A and B except accessories and entries in classes 28-30 must have been grown or produced on the exhibitor's own premises or allotment.
7. The committee reserves the right to refuse any entry and in the event of such a refusal is not required to give any reason or explanation.
8. Only officials and judges will be allowed in the hall at the time of judging.
9. Any complaints must be lodged within half-an-hour of the opening of the Show with the Show Secretary.
10. The number of prizes awarded shall be at the discretion of the judges whose decisions shall be final as to the relative merits of the exhibits and the decision of the committee shall be final as to the other matters connected with the Show.
11. No exhibitor shall enter more than one exhibit per class.
12. Exhibits must be shown in the exhibitor's own trays, dishes, plates, vases or bowls as specified in the schedule.
13. An exhibit may be removed or re-arranged only by the exhibitor or a steward.
14. The committee shall have the power to inspect any exhibitor's garden or allotment in the event of a dispute.
15. The committee cannot be held responsible for loss or damage to an exhibitor's property but all reasonable care will be taken.
16. All trophies awarded for one year only. To be polished and returned to the Show Secretary at least two weeks before the 2027 Show date.
17. All attendees on payment of £1 entry to the show can vote for the People's Award.
18. No dogs except guide dogs are allowed in the hall.
